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
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


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Kiwanis Family History

The Kiwanis Family was originally started in 1915 by the Kiwanis Organization and has grown substantially since then. The Kiwanis Organization's goal is to perform meaningful service, with service to children as their priority. They started with sponsoring Key Club and went on to sponsor other clubs, including Circle K, K-Kids, Builders Club, Aktion Club, and many other programs that benefit local communities and the world!

Overview of Kiwanis Family ⁷

K-kids: The primary school level of Kiwanis, K-kids stands for Kiwanis Kids. It is one of the only opportunities for primary students to learn about self empowerment and leadership through service.

Builder's club: The middle school level of Kiwanis builds on the self empowerment skills and leadership taught in K-Kids.

Key Club: The high school level of Kiwanis, continues on the same path as K-Kids and Builders Club. It is the oldest and largest student led service organization in the world.

Circle K: The college level of Kiwanis; it is an opportunity for students to lead through service after school. It is the largest student led organization for college students.

Aktion Club: One of the only opportunities for adults living with disabilities to lead through service.

Kiwanis International: Kiwanis international is a community of global clubs, members, and partners devoted to helping children. Kiwanis international offers clubs for adults, Kiwanians are adults who serve their community, annually raising more than \$100 million and 18.50 million hours of service to build communities and help families.

History and Structure of Key⁸ Club International

Key Club International was founded in 1925 in Sacramento, California by two Kiwanis members who were also high school administrators. Key Club gets its name from the original intention of the “key” boys of the school providing service and building school spirit. The purpose of the organization is to provide students with opportunities to serve their homes, schools, and communities. The club also provides students with an opportunity to gain leadership skills and build character. Currently, Key Club has 1000s of clubs in 45 countries.

Member Level

More than 276,000 members make up Key Club International. This is the most important level of Key Club. Members are the ones who motivate the other levels to work harder and stay dedicated to our passion for service.

Club Level

Clubs are found in high schools around the world and consist of members, an advisor, President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Class Representatives. Elections are held for officers of clubs.

Division Level

Each division elects a lieutenant governor to serve them, provide support, and carry out district responsibilities. Clubs in a certain area form Divisions.

District Level

Multiple divisions make up each district. There are currently 33 organized districts, and each one is led by a District Governor. The District Board is made up of each division's lieutenant governor, District Chairs, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Bulletin Editor, a Historian, and a District Governor.

International Level

The international board is composed of trustees, an International President, and an International Vice President. Key Club International consists of 33 organized districts and other countries that are not included in those districts.

International Convention, also known as ICON, is a week-long experience. Unlike DCON, ICON allows Key Club members from all over the world to attend! At ICON, you will be able to meet other Key Club members and candidates for the International board, pin trade, attend workshops and caucus session, and hear multiple keynote speakers. ICON is also when you will be voting for the next year's board, as well as voting on proposed amendments. The KT district will be touring Atlanta and more information about the tour is to come!

Dues Payment

In order for a Key Club to be active, members must pay dues. Dues are \$14 per member. \$7 goes to Key Club International and the other \$7 goes to the K-T District. Clubs/schools may add extra fees onto this price.

- *Submit dues by November 1, 2023 to receive the Early Bird Award!*
- *Annual Key Club dues become Delinquent December 1, 2023.*
- *Unpaid clubs become suspended February 1, 2024.*
