The Youth Opportunity Fund is a great way for clubs to get the money they need for service projects. YOF has two cycles, a Fall and Spring cycle. We encourage all clubs in our district to apply for this amazing opportunity. Clubs can get from \$250-\$2,000 for their club. However, clubs may only apply ONCE each year. Applications for this year's Fall Cycle must be submitted by October 15th. There are some requirements clubs have to meet before applying, so please check for those on the keyclub.org/youthopportunityfunds and use the same website to apply as well! #### Club Dues



Show people what Key Club is all about! Spread the word by wearing Key Club gear and publicizing Key Club Week in local stores, your school, or even just by going out to run errands that day.




