Youth Opportunities Fund

The Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF) is an endowed fund for Key Club International held within the Kiwanis International Children's Fund. This fund uses earned interest to help Key Clubs and Key Club members serve the world by providing grants for service opportunities and scholarships for members.

- -Applications are accepted from summer through fall and must be received by October 15th at 11:59 PM EST
- -Applications are reviewed at International Board during their November Meeting
- -Clubs may request assistance ranging anywhere from \$100 to \$2000 USD. The board typically funds those clubs who are asking for a portion of the total cost of the project and clubs who are working with other organizations to fund and complete the project.
- -Guidelines for submitting a YOF application are listed in the Key Club Guidebook under Board Policies
- -YOF grant notification is emailed to all grant applicants the second week of January
