Surf into Service: Last Year's Divisional Service Project Recap

Recently, Ashland Build A Bed held its 2nd annual community event on April 6, 2019. The group's mission is to see that no child sleeps on the floor, and it accomplishes that by building beds for kids in need. This year, over 222 volunteers were present and 100 beds were built by the community volunteers. Volunteers were community members from local businesses, churches, schools, and professional groups. Our K Family played a crucial part of the overall project by contributing to a campaign to collect items needed for the Bedtime Bundle Kits that were sent along with the beds. The bundle kits included items needed for bedtime: comforter/quilt, sheet set, pillow, stuffed animal, book, full-size bottles of shampoo & conditioner, body wash, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, night light, alarm clocks, and special bedtime snacks. Most kits included little extras for age appropriate kids.

Boyd County HS Key Club (BCHS) decided to coordinate a bedtime bundle drive to assist with the project. What started out as just a hygiene drive ended up being so much more after seeing the overall involvement of the neighboring Key Clubs. BCHS met with officers from other local clubs to invite participation and to decide which items are to be collected. Each club selected different items, made that their focus, and set a goal to collect at least 75 items. BCHS decided the drive needed to be turned into the full blown campaign called "Key to Sweet Dreams" and proceeded to coordinate item transportation and storage, organize the inventory, correspond with the Build A Bed planning board, purchase any missing items, assemble the bundles according to age and gender, relocate the kits to the product location, and manage distribution to families the day of the event.

What a success! What an effort from our K Family and other amazing local groups! The campaign finished with collecting all the items needed to complete 300 bags with each bag valued at \$130-\$150 and consisting of 15 items. That was a total donation of over 1500 items with a value of approximately \$14,000! This would not have been possible without the combined forces of ALL groups.
