Youth Opportunities Fund






Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF) gives Key Clubs the funds to do impactful service projects for their communities. Clubs may request funding assistance from \$100 to \$2,000. YOF applications open September 1st and all applications must be submitted by October 15th. those applications are reviews in November, and grants are given in early January. YOF grant money can be used in a variety of ways; DuPont Manual High School in Louisville, KY was granted \$1,000 to create supply bags for Volunteers of America and Ridgeland High School in Rossville, GA used YOF grant money to provide a service dog to an individual in need.

Fall Rally:

The 2019 annual Dollywood Fall Rally is October 19th, 2019 in Pigeon Forge, TN. This is a fun and exciting way to meet Key Clubbers and Kiwanis from all over the Kentucky-Tennessee District! The cost is \$50 and this includes Park admission, a Meal Voucher, and a Fall Rally T-shirt. This is a great discount considering regular park admission is \$84.15.
