Governor's Update


Hello K-T,


Secretary's Update


I hope you all have had a fantastic Key Club year! I know this year has been presented with various challenges and obstacles, but we made it through!




Treasurer's Update


Hey K-T,


Historian's Update







Fundraising

These are various virtual fundraisers that I've seen work for Key Clubs across KCI

- Bingo! Create a bingo board full of dares/challenges for your club officers, each with a dollar amount assigned to it. Start a gofundme (or share an existing one), and encourage club members to donate to it. When members donate to the gofundme, if they donate the dollar amount assigned to a dare, the board of club officers must complete the dare. An example image is attached
- Sell stickers! Redbubble is a great website for people to sell their artwork. Ask volunteers to create drawings as they relate to either your Key Club or the fundraiser, then sell them online.
- Host a gaming tournament. Minecraft and Among Us are pretty popular right now! Host a tournament with your school to see who the best gamers are. Charge an individual/team entry fee for players, run the tournament, and 1st place takes a prize (preferably an inexpensive/donated one).

Personal experiences/advice:

- Cross your t's and dot your i's: Running fundraisers through your school can be difficult sometimes! Make sure that you are well-versed in all the rules that your school has set in place regarding fundraisers.
- Promotion: Key Clubbers are not the only ones that can support your cause. Make sure that when promoting your fundraiser, you are extending the information outside of your club's bubble. This can also be a great way to get new members.
- Incentives: If you can hold an in-person fundraiser, you're going to need volunteers. Offer up some volunteer hours to fellow Key Clubbers that wish to support your cause.


New Club Building



Election Process / Responsibilities: It is really simple! You should run for endorsement at your division's Spring Rally, then you lead a campaign at DCON. You will recite short speeches during caucus sessions, and members will be allowed to ask you questions. After a few caucuses, you present at the House of Delegates for final thoughts & questions. Then, delegates from across the District vote for candidates. If you are elected, your primary responsibility is to help club treasurers. You should publish information to your LTGs that they can then send to aid their treasurers; these publications can include anything from how to pay dues to fundraiser ideas. You also have a responsibility to keep the board informed about the status of dues in the District; you are to create monthly publications that highlight which clubs are paid, membership counts, and other stats.

Prior Knowledge: I've held the multiple treasurer positions, and I had a full year on the board prior to becoming District Treasurer, so there is not much I "wish" I knew. For someone that doesn't have my experience, there are definitely a few things you should know:

- It is incredibly important that you spend time working with your board
 —you are more of a board member than you are a Treasurer.
- Know your dates!!! Oct 1, Nov 1, Dec 1, and Feb 1 are perhaps the most important dates a Treasurer can know. Make sure you are familiar with them before you even run for the position.
- You are not actually "in charge" of the district's money, rather, you report on the district's money & keep everyone informed about information regarding it.
- Favorite Moment: Meeting all of the other Treasurers and creating a group chat and discord server during virtual ICON.
- Struggles: With a consistent schedule, you shouldn't face many struggles regarding Treasurer duties. Every treasurer faces struggles with demotivation; stay motivated and get those monthly reports done for your board!



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
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
