Dues Payment

1. Go to www.keyclub.org and look for "Dues and Reports"
3. Click on "Membership Update Center" (MUC)
4. When logging in for the first time, click "register/reset password" (The first time you use the system, do not fill in your email and attempt to put in a password. Instead, click Register/Reset Password the first time you use the MUC)
5. Once you have logged on:
 - Follow prompts on screen to Update advisor information, update officer information, update member information, and add new members
 - Create an invoice by clicking "roster" and print the invoice
 - Make payment according to the directions on the website
 - Repeat the steps for each time you add members

Thursday: Random acts of Kindness

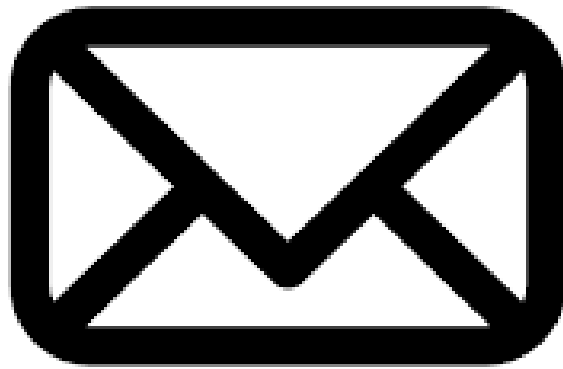
- Spread joy to others by implementing simple acts of kindness throughout your day
